Many works attributable to Ismaili scholars however are still unavailable either because they remain hidden in private collections or because they have not survived. Ismaili law in particular is still a largely unexplored field of study. Al-Qadi Abu Hanifa al-Nu'man is generally considered the founder and greatest exponent of Ismaili jurisprudence.
