The Demons The Jinn:

The Demons(the Jinn) Razzab Shaikh,2014-10-30 Arabian spirits perhaps animistic but more probably strictly mythological like the Persian divs The jinn were said to have been created out of fire and to have occupied the Earth for several thousand years before Adam They were perverse and would not reform although prophets were sent to reclaim them they were eventually driven from the Earth and took refuge in the outlying islands of the sea One of the number named Azazeel afterward called Iblees was carried off as a prisoner by angels He grew up among them and became their chief but when he refused to prostrate himself before Adam he was degraded to the condition of a sheyt n devil and became the father of the sheyt ns The jinn are not immortal and according to legend are destined ultimately to die They eat and drink and propagate their species live in communities and are ruled over by princes They can make themselves visible or invisible and they assume the forms of various animals such as serpents cats and dogs There are good jinn and bad jinn They are said to frequent baths wells latrines ovens ruined houses rivers crossroads and marketplaces Like the demons of Jewish traditions they ascend to heaven and learn the future by eavesdropping With all their power and knowledge however they are liable to be reduced to obedience by means of talismans or occult arts and become obsequious servants until the spell is broken It is far from certain that the jinn of the East were derived from the mythology or philosophy of the West and the practice of translating the Arabic word jinn by the Latin term genius arose more from an apparent resemblance in the names than from any identity in the nature and functions of those imaginary beings This similarity of name however must have been purely accidental for the Arabs knew little or nothing of the Latin language Demon not genius is the word they probably would have used if they had borrowed this part of their creed from the West Jinn appears moreover to be a genuine Arabic word derived from a root signifying to veil or to conceal it therefore means properly that which is veiled and cannot be seen In one sense states Fr s b d C m s vol 3 p 611 the word Jinn signifies any spiritual being concealed from all our senses and for that reason the converse of a material being Taken in this extensive sense the word Jinn comprehends devils as well as angels but there are some properties common to both angels and Jinn some peculiar to each Every angel is a Jinn but every Jinn is not an angel In another sense this term is applied peculiarly to a particular kind of spiritual being for such beings are of three kinds the good which are angels the bad devils and the intermediate comprehending both good and bad who form the class of Jinn Thus Arabs acknowledged good and bad jinn in that respect agreeing with the Greeks but differing from the Persians The genii so long familiar to European readers through the Arabian Nights are not the same beings but rather are the divs and d vat s of Indian romance dressed up in a foreign attire to please the tastes of readers in Persia and Arabia The principal differences therefore between the genii of the West and the jinn of the East seem to have been as follows the genii were deities of an inferior rank the constant companions and guardians of men capable of giving useful or prophetic impulses acting as mediators and messengers between the gods and men Some were supposed to be friendly others hostile and many

Western iconography sometimes depicts angels as fat cherubic babies or handsome young men or women with a halo surrounding their head. In Islamic doctrine, they are real created beings who will eventually suffer death but are generally hidden from our senses. They are not divine or semi-divine and they are not God's associates running different districts of the universe. Also, they are not objects to be worshipped or prayed to as they do not deliver our prayers to God. They all submit to God and carry out His commands. In the Islamic worldview, there are no fallen angels; they are not divided into good and evil angels. Human beings do not become angels after death. Satan is not a fallen angel but is one of the jinn, a demon, a creation of God parallel to human beings and angels. Angels were created from light before human beings were created and thus their graphic or symbolic representation in Islamic art is rare. Nevertheless, they are generally beautiful beings with wings as described in Muslim scripture. The Arabic word Jinn is from the verb Janna and means to hide or conceal. The Jinn or Demon are so called because they conceal themselves from people's sight. The words janneen, foetus and mijann shield come from the same root. Jinn or demon, as the name suggests, are normally invisible to humans. The jinn are part of God's creation. They were created from fire before the creation of Adam and humankind. And indeed, We created man from dried sounding clay of altered mud. And the jinn, Demon, We created aforetime from the smokeless flame of fire. Quran 15:26-27. According to the traditions of Prophet Muhammad, the angels were created from light, the jinn from fire, and humankind from what has been described to you meaning clay. God created the angels, jinn, and humankind for no other purpose than to worship Him. I did not create the Jinn and mankind except to worship Me. Quran 51:56. Jinn exist in our world but they live on their own. Jinn have their own distinct nature and features and they generally remain hidden from humankind. Jinn and humans do have some common traits, the

Religion of the Semites (Ppr) William Robertson Smith, Scottish Semiticist and Arabist William Robertson Smith was a celebrated biblical critic theorist of religion and theorist of myth His accomplishments were multiple Smith's German mentors reconstructed the history of Israelite religion from the Bible itself Smith ventured outside the Bible to Semitic religion and thereby pioneered the comparative study of religion Where others viewed religion from the standpoint of the individual Smith approached religion at least

ancient religion from the standpoint of the group He asserted that ancient religion was centrally a matter of practice not creed and singlehandedly created the ritualist theory of myth Since Smith's time the ritualist theory of myth has found adherents not only in biblical studies but in classics anthropology and literature as well Smith's accomplishments are seen most fully in *Religion of the Semites* adapted from a number of public lectures he gave at Aberdeen and first published in 1889 Smith delivered three courses of lectures over three years It is this set that is reprinted here Only recently were the notes for the second and third courses of lectures discovered and published *Religion of the Semites* combines extraordinary philological erudition with brilliant theorizing Among the fundamental emphases of the book are the foci on sacrifice as the key ritual and non ancient sacrifice as communion with God rather than as penance for sin Most important is Smith's use of the comparative method he uses cross cultural examples from other primitive peoples to confirm his reconstruction from Semitic sources Smith combines pioneering sociology and anthropology with a staunchly Christian faith For him Christianity is an expression of divine revelation For Smith only continuing revelation can account for the leap from the collective ritualistic and materialistic nature of ancient Semitic religion to the individualistic creedal and spiritualized nature of Christianity *Lectures on the Religion of the Semites* manages to meld social science with theology and remains a classic work in the social scientific study of religion
