Arthur Schopenhauer David Bather Woods, 2025-11-19 An engaging biography of one of the most influential Western philosophers and a thought provoking exploration of how to live with Arthur Schopenhauer's pessimism Arthur Schopenhauer 1788-1860 almost wasn't one of the greatest philosophers of the nineteenth century Born in the Free City of Danzig to a family of shipping merchants he was destined for a life of imports and exports until his father died in a suspected suicide After much deliberation the young Schopenhauer invested his inheritance in himself and his philosophical vocation But the long road to recognition was a difficult one with Schopenhauer spending all but the last decade of his life in total obscurity Yet his ideas and style went on to influence great thinkers including Friedrich Nietzsche Ludwig Wittgenstein and Sigmund Freud as well as artists such as the composer Richard Wagner and writers Marcel Proust Thomas Mann Samuel Beckett and many more A singular and remarkably influential thinker Schopenhauer is usually described as an extreme pessimist He questioned the purpose of existence in a world where pain and suffering are inescapable and happiness is all too brief In this engaging philosophical biography David Bather Woods reevaluates Schopenhauer's pessimism in the context of his life experiences revealing the philosopher's relentless fascination with the world and making a case for his contemporary relevance Bather Woods weaves together Schopenhauer's ideas with the story of how he came to be including such topics as love loneliness morality politics gender sexuality death suicide fame and madness In doing so this book answers some of life's most challenging questions about how to deal with pain and loss and how to live with ourselves and each other Despite his pessimistic outlook on human existence Schopenhauer didn't give up on life Rather he recognized that the question of how to live becomes even more pressing and he worked to provide an answer Bather Woods shows how Schopenhauer's life informed his ideas and how they still resonate today

The Trauma of Freud Paul Roazen,2018-04-24 Over one hundred years have passed since Sigmund Freud first created psychoanalysis The new profession flourished within the increasing secularization of Western culture and it is almost impossible to overestimate its influence Despite its traditional aloofness from ethical questions psychoanalysis attracted an extraordinary degree of sectarian bitterness Original thinkers were condemned as dissidents and renegades and the merits of individual cases have been frequently mixed up with questions concerning power and ambition as well as the future of the movement In *The Trauma of Freud* Paul Roazen shows how despite this contentiousness Freud s legacy has remained central to human selfawareness Roazen provides a much needed sequence and perspective on the memorable issues that have come up in connection with the history of Freud s school Topics covered include the problem of seduction Jung s Zurich school Ferenczi s Hungarian following and the influence of Melanie Klein and Anna Freud in England Also highlighted are Lacanianism in France Erik Erikson s ego psychology and Sandor Rado s innovations In considering these historical cases and related public scandals Roazen continually addresses important general

issues concerning ethics and privacy the power of orthodoxy creativity and the historiography of psychoanalysis Throughout he argues that rival interpretations are a sign of the intellectual maturity and sophistication of the discipline Vigorous debate is healthy and essential in avoiding ill considered and dogmatic self assurance He observes that potential zealotry lies just below the surface of even the most placid psychoanalytic waters even today Examining the past so much a part of the job of scholarship may involve challenging those who might have preferred to let sleeping dogs lie Roazen emphasizes that Freud's approach rested on the Socratic conviction that the unexamined life is not worth living and that this constitutes the spiritual basis of its influence beyond immediate clinical concerns The Trauma of Freud is a major contribution to the historical literature on psychoanalysis

British Romanticism and Prison Reform Jonas Cope, 2024 In eighteenth century Britain criminals were routinely whipped branded hanged or transported to America Only in the last quarter of the century with the War of American Independence and legal and sociopolitical challenges to capital punishment did the criminal justice system change resulting in the reformed prison or penitentiary meant to educate rehabilitate and spiritualize even hardened felons This volume is the first to explore the relationship between historical penal reform and Romantic era literary texts by luminaries such as Godwin Keats Byron and Austen The works examined here treat incarceration as ambiguous prison walls oppress and reinforce the arbitrary power of legal structures but can also heighten meditation intensify the imagination and awaken the conscience Jonas Cope skillfully traces the important ideological work these texts attempt to reconcile a culture devoted to freedom with the birth of the modern prison system that presents punishment as a form of rehabilitation

Singing by Herself Amelia Worsley, 2024-08-15 *Singing by Herself* reinterprets the rise of literary loneliness by foregrounding the female and feminized figures who have been overlooked in previous histories of solitude Many of the earliest records of the terms lonely and loneliness in British literature describe solitaries whose songs positioned them within the tradition of female complaint Amelia Worsley shows how these feminized solitaries for whom loneliness was both a space of danger and a space of productive retreat helped to make loneliness attractive to future lonely poets despite the sense of suspicion it evoked Although loneliness today is often associated with states of atomized interiority soliloquy and self enclosure this study of eighteenth century poetry disrupts the presumed association between isolation singular speech and bounded models of poetic subjectivity In five chapters focused on lonely poet figures in the works of John Milton Anne Finch Alexander Pope Thomas Gray and Charlotte Smith which also take account of the wider eighteenth century fascination with

literary loneliness *Singing by Herself* shows how poets increasingly associated the new literary mode of being alone with states of disembodiment dispersal and echoic self doubling. Seemingly solitary lonely voices often dissolve into polyvocal allusive community. Worsley argues when in dialogue with each other and also with classical figures of feminized lament such as Sappho, Echo and Philomela. The book's provocative reflections on lyric mean that it will have a broad appeal to scholars interested in the history of poetry and poetics as well as to those who study the literary history of gender affect and emotion.
