Prophet John Wroe Edward Green,2005-06-23 Prophet John Wroe 1782 1863 found fame through his many predictions his preaching and the establishment of the Christian Israelite Church in the early 1820s Edward Green places Wroe s life and career in the context of an industrialised society struggling to find values and needing to believe in themselves as the Chosen People The Murders at Bill's O'Jack's Giles Wilcock,2025-01-16 On 3 April 1832 a twelve year old girl visited her

grandfather s house a public house known as Bill s o Jack s on the edge of Saddleworth Moor only to find her uncle dying on the floor of a room saturated with blood Upstairs her grandfather lay in his bed having suffered mortal injuries Neither man lived long enough to explain what had happened The story of the murders of William and Thomas Bradbury quickly spread throughout the local area and beyond precipitating a frantic hunt for suspects No one was ever charged and the case remains unsolved but the story never quite went away becoming a legend that long outlived those directly affected The Bill s o Jack s Murders took place at a time of great change and the background to the case encompassed many issues including political reform enclosure and the growing influence of newspapers It was a crime very much of its time shaped by contemporary issues and concerns Yet the legend took on a life of its own removed from any historical context and continued to grow for almost a hundred years before settling down into a final form that only vaguely reflected reality Bill s o Jack s itself made infamous by the events of 1832 became an integral part of the local community and thrived on its notoriety until it was demolished in 1937 This book follows the story from that first morning and traces its transmutation into legend It examines the events leading up to the death of William and Thomas Bradbury and the aftermath of the murders it describes the lives of those affected the families the suspects and the journalists and places everything within the context of the tumultuous Georgian era **The History of a Modern Millennial Movement** Jane Shaw,Philip Lockley,2017-05-30 A feverish

Howcroft, 1923 A Tale of Two Passes William Lowell Putnam, 2008-08-01 William Putnam s book chronicles the history of two important routes through the Alps which are devoted to treasuring the history of Mont Cenis and the Great Saint Bernard passages Both of these passes were prominently and frequently used by the Romans in establishing and maintaining their empire It is surmised that Hannibal and his troops found elephant friendly passages through the Mont Cenis corridor Both passes were adorned with hospices shelters near their crest and both now have been
