Sir to find this system approaching so near to perfection as it does and I think it will astonish our enemies who are waiting with confidence to hear that our councils are confounded like those of the Builders of Babel and that our States are on the point of separation only to meet hereafter for the purpose of cutting one another's throats Thus I consent Sir to this Constitution because I expect no better and because I am not sure that it is not the best However even after the final document was ready it still had to be ratified by the colonies which required the delegates to attempt to argue for or against it Nobody did this better than John Jay Alexander Hamilton and James Madison in the Federalist Papers which are now among the most famous and influential political writings in the nation's history.
