Establishment of the great European empires through the growth of a multipolar world

The Foundations of European Empires, 1441-1619	
1441	Portuguese traders buy slaves in Africa, initiating the Euro-African slave trade.
1462	Portugal founds a colony at the Cape Verde Islands off the western coast of Africa.
1482	Portuguese traders build a trading fortress, São Jorge da Mina (a.k.a. Elmina Castle), in West Africa.
1492	- Spain completes the Reconquista, driving Muslim Moors from the Iberian Peninsula. - Christopher Columbus lands in the Bahamas on behalf of Spain.
1493	Pope Alexander VI issues the document <i>Inter Caetera</i> , which divides the New World between Spain and Portugal.
1497	Italian explorer John Cabot claims Newfoundland for England.
1498	Portuguese explorer Vasco da Gama lands in India, marking the commencement of the Portuguese effort, led by Prince Henry the Navigator, to discover a route to the Indian Ocean around the Cape of Good Hope.
1500	The world population is estimated to have been 500 million.
1502	- The first African slaves arrive in the Americas. - Muchotoma II becomes the leader of the Aztec Empire and begins expanding its reach.
1507	Portuguese explorer Afonso de Albuquerque captures Hormuz, an island in the channel between the Persian Gulf and the Gulf of Oman, to open Persian trade with Europe. He will later capture Goa (1510) and Malacca (1511), giving Portugal an advantage over Muslim traders in the Indian Ocean.
1509	Henry VIII becomes king of England.
1513	Portuguese explorer Jorge Álvares lands in China.
1519	Hapsburg Charles V is elected Holy Roman Emperor.
1521	- Portuguese explorer Ferdinand Magellan is killed in the Philippines while attempting to circumnavigate the globe for Spain. - Spanish conquistador Hernán Cortés defeats the Aztecs in Mexico.
1524	Italian Giovanni da Verrazzano explores the eastern coast of North America on behalf of France.
1531	Salvador Díaz sees a vision of the Virgin Mary, leading to the rapid Christianization of Mexico.
1533	Spanish Francisco Pizarro conquers the Inca Empire in Peru.
1535	The Viceroyalty of New Spain is established with its capital in Mexico City to govern Spain's territories in the New World.
1545	Silver mines are established in South America at Potosí. Between 1560 and 1600, mines will produce nearly 50,000 tons of silver per year.
1552	<i>A Short Account of the Destruction of the Indies</i> , by Spanish Dominican friar Bartolomé de las Casas, is published, condemning Spain's treatment of Indians.
1555	The Muscovy Company is founded to facilitate English merchant trade with Russia.
1556	Holy Roman Emperor Charles V abdicates, leaving Austria, Germany, and central Europe to his brother Ferdinand I and Spain, the Netherlands, and southern Italy to his son Philip II.
1558	Elizabeth I becomes Queen of England.



Christopher Columbus

1555	The Dutch revolt against Spanish rule begins.
1571	- The European Holy League defeats the Islamic Ottoman Empire at the Battle of Lepanto, checking the Ottoman advance into Europe. - The Spanish capture Manila in the Philippines, helping to advance the global silver trade that links East and West.
1580	English captain Sir Francis Drake completes his circumnavigation of the globe, attacking Spanish settlements and ships along the way.
1588	England defeats the Spanish Armada.
1591	The Portuguese order construction of Fort Jesus outside Mozambique, in East Africa, to protect trade interests in the region.
1600	The English East India Company is founded. It will establish settlements along the coast of India at Madras (1609), Bombay (1608), and Calcutta (1690).
1602	The Dutch East India Company is formed. It will establish settlements in Indonesia.
1607	An English colony at Jamestown in North America is founded.
1608	Samuel de Champlain founds a French settlement at Québec.
1609	Henry Hudson explores the Hudson River on behalf of the Dutch.
1619	- Approx. 90%-95% of the native population of the Caribbean island of Hispaniola has died since European contact, a pattern typical of native populations throughout the Americas. - The first African slaves arrive in the colony of Virginia.

Empires of the East, 1405-1644

1405	- Zheng He begins a series of voyages across the Indian Ocean on behalf of China, establishing contact with India, the Arabian Peninsula, and East Africa. - China ends the Marine policy that had curtailed foreign trade in effort to combat smuggling.
1406	Construction of the Forbidden City, home to China's emperors, begins in Beijing.
1453	- Led by Mehmed the Conqueror, Ottoman Empire forces capture Constantinople, capital of the Byzantine Empire, and rename it Istanbul. - Campanians into Athens (1458), Bosnia (1463), Hungary (1492), and Croatia (1497) will follow. - An invasion of Italy is attempted (1499), but recedes in short-lived. - Constantinople's Hagia Sophia, the largest church in the Christian world, is converted into a mosque.
1468	Expanding the Songhai Empire, King Sonni 'Ali takes control of Timbuktu.
1470	Mehmed II begins construction of Topkapı Palace in Istanbul to become the center of the Ottoman Empire.
1501	Isma'il I becomes Shah of Iran and founds the Safavid dynasty in Persia.
1514	The Ottomans defeat the Safavids of Iran at the Battle of Chaldiran to gain control of eastern Anatolia.
1517	Ottoman forces wrest Egypt from the Mamluk sultanate.
1520	Süleyman the Magnificent begins his 46-year reign as the head of the Ottoman Empire. He will add territories in Serbia (1521), Croatia (1527), Hungary (1526), Iraq (1534), Azerbaijan (1534), Tunis (1535), and Yemen (1547) to the empire.
1526	Zahîr-ud-din Muhammad Babur gains control of the Indian subcontinent at the Battle of Panipat and establishes the Mughal Empire.
1529	The Muslim forces of the Achaemenid defeat Christian Ethiopia at the Battle of Shilsha Kere .
1547	Ivan the Terrible becomes the first czar of Russia.

1550	China reinstates the Marine policy , forbidding seaborne trade.
1555	Algeria comes under the control of the Ottoman Empire.
1556	Akbar the Great assumes leadership of the Mughal Empire, and he: - Gains control over much of the Indian subcontinent by 1575 and conquers Afghanistan in 1581. - Reforms the military through the mansabdar system, which ensures the readiness to fight. - Reduces the power of the conservative traditional tax collectors and increases tax revenues.
1574	- A wall is built at Macao to deny Portuguese traders access to mainland China. - The Ottoman Empire adds Tunisia to its territory.
ca. 1585	King Kungahle Mankema establishes the Kingdom of Luba in Central Africa.
1591	- Weakened by internal tensions, the Songhai Empire is defeated at the Battle of Tondibi by the Sultan of Morocco. - Toyotomi Hideyoshi unifies Japan.
1598	Safavid Shah 'Abbas the Great defeats Dutch forces along the south of the empire.
1599	An estimated 400,000 people reside in Istanbul, the largest city outside of China.
1603	Tokugawa Iyeyasu brings order to the chaotic rule of regional families in Japan by becoming shogun-military leader and creating the Tokugawa shogunate dynasty. - The capital is moved from Kyoto to Edo (now Tokyo). - He reforms the tax system to extract greater revenues for himself and launches agricultural improvements to raise crop yields.
1612	Shah Abbas the Great concludes the <i>Treaty of Nis</i> with the Ottoman Empire, recognizing Safavid territorial gains in Iran and Armenia.
1613	Mikhail I establishes the Romanov dynasty in Russia.
ca. 1625	Shayim a-Muhammad Ngweng-Ngweng forges the Nzaha Kingdom from several smaller territories in Central Africa.
1632	Mughal emperor Shah Jahan of India begins construction of the Taj Mahal in memory of his deceased wife.
1633	Japan begins instituting the Sakoku policy to isolate Japanese people from foreign influence.
1644	The Ming dynasty in China falls after their defeat at the Battle of Shanhai Pass , to be replaced by the Qing dynasty.

Early Modern Religious, Artistic & Intellectual Movements, 1491-1704

1491	King of Kongo Nzinga a Nkundu is baptized by Portuguese Catholic priests, becoming King João I. His conversion leads to the establishment of the Catholic Church in Kongo.
1498	Leonardo da Vinci completes <i>The Last Supper</i> .
1499	Giordano Bruno begins to spread teachings that will form the SRM religious tradition.
1501	Isma'il I names Shia Islam as the official religion of the Safavid Empire.
1503	Da Vinci commences the <i>Adamo Lino</i> .
1508	Michelangelo begins painting the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel.
1513	<i>The Prince</i> by Niccolò Machiavelli is published.
1516	Sir Thomas More publishes <i>Utopia</i> , outlining the structure of an ideal society.
