The Patchwork of World History in Texas High Schools Stephen Jackson, 2022-11-30 This book traces the historical development of the World History course as it has been taught in high school classrooms in Texas a populous and nationally influential state over the last hundred years Arguing that the course is a result of a patchwork of competing groups and ideas that have intersected over the past century with each new framework patched over but never completely erased or replaced the author crucially examines themes of imperialism Eurocentrism and nationalism in both textbooks and the curriculum more broadly.
