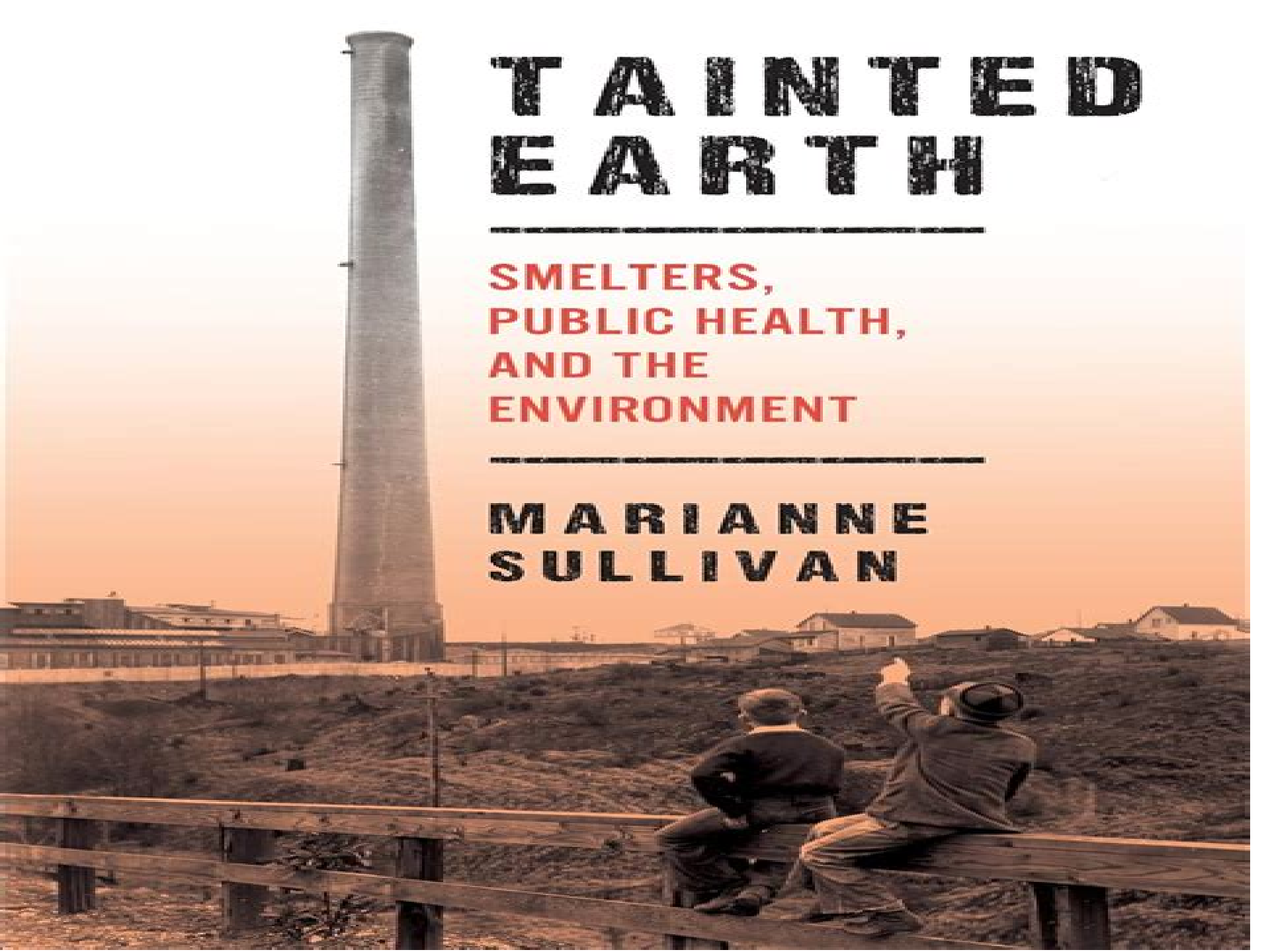




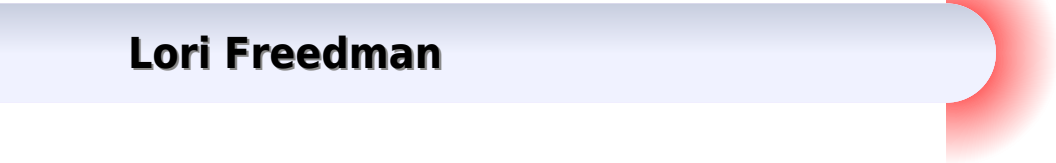

Tainted Earth Smelters Public Health And The Environment Marianne Sullivan:

Tainted Earth Marianne Sullivan, 2014-01-23 Smelting is an industrial process involving the extraction of metal from ore. During this process, impurities in ore including arsenic, lead, and cadmium may be released from smoke stacks, contaminating air, water, and soil with toxic heavy metals. The problem of public health harm from smelter emissions received little official attention for much of the twentieth century. Though people living near smelters periodically complained that their health was impaired by both sulfur dioxide and heavy metals, for much of the century there was strong deference to industry claims that smelter operations were a nuisance and not a serious threat to health. It was only when the majority of children living near the El Paso Texas smelter were discovered to be lead exposed in the early 1970s that systematic independent investigation of exposure to heavy metals in smelting communities began. Following El Paso, an even more serious lead poisoning epidemic was discovered around the Bunker Hill smelter in northern Idaho. In Tacoma, Washington, a copper smelter exposed children to arsenic, a carcinogenic threat. Thoroughly grounded in extensive archival research, *Tainted Earth* traces the rise of public health concerns about nonferrous smelting in the western United States, focusing on three major facilities: Tacoma, Washington; El Paso, Texas; and Bunker Hill, Idaho. Marianne Sullivan documents the response from community residents, public health scientists, the industry, and the government to pollution from smelters, as well as the long road to protecting public health and the environment. Placing the environmental and public health aspects of smelting in historical context, the book connects local incidents to national stories on the regulation of airborne toxic metals. The nonferrous smelting industry has left a toxic legacy in the United States and around the world. Unless these toxic metals are cleaned up, they will persist in the environment and may sicken people, children in particular, for generations to come. The twentieth-century struggle to control smelter pollution shares many similarities with public health battles with such industries as tobacco and asbestos, where industry-supported science created doubt about harm and reluctant government regulators did not take decisive action to protect the public's health.

The Sounds of Furious Living Matthew Kelly, 2023-10-13 Four decades have passed since reports of a mysterious gay cancer first appeared in US newspapers. In the ensuing years, the pandemic that would come to be called AIDS changed the world in innumerable ways. It also gave rise to one of the late twentieth century's largest health-based empowerment movements. Scholars across diverse traditions have documented the rise of the AIDS activist movement, chronicling the impassioned echoes of protestors who took to the streets to demand drugs into bodies. And yet, not all activism creates echoes. Included among the ranks of 1980s and 1990s era AIDS activists were individuals whose expressions of empowerment differed markedly from those demanding open access to mainstream pharmaceutical agents. Largely forgotten today, this activist tradition was comprised of individuals who embraced unorthodox approaches for conceptualizing and treating their condition. Rejecting biomedical expertise, they shared alternative clinical paradigms, created underground networks for distributing unorthodox nostrums, and endorsed etiological

models that challenged the association between HIV and AIDS The theatre of their protests was not the streets of New York City's Greenwich Village but rather their bodies And their language was not the riotous chants of public demonstration but the often invisible embrace of contrarian systems for defining and treating their disease The Sounds of Furious Living seeks to understand the AIDS activist tradition identifying the historical currents out of which it arose Embracing a patient centered social historical lens it traces historic shifts in popular understanding of health and perceptions of biomedicine through the nineteenth and twentieth centuries to explain the lasting appeal of unorthodox health activism into the modern era In asking how unorthodox health activism flourished during the twentieth century's last major pandemic Kelly also seeks to inform our understanding of resistance to biomedical authority in the setting of the twenty first century's first major pandemic COVID 19 As a deeply researched portrait of distrust and disenchantment The Sounds of Furious Living helps explain the persistence of movements that challenge biomedicine's authority well into a century marked by biomedical innovation while simultaneously posing important questions regarding the meaning and metrics of patient empowerment in clinical practice

From Residency to Retirement Terry Mizrahi, 2021-04-16 From Residency to Retirement tells the stories of twenty American doctors over the last half century which saw a period of continuous turbulent and transformative changes to the U S health care system The cohort's experiences are reflective of the generation of physicians who came of age as presidents Carter and Reagan began to focus on costs and benefits of health services Mizrahi observed and interviewed these physicians in six timeframes ending

in 2016 Beginning with medical school in the mid 1970s these physicians reveal the myriad fluctuations and uncertainties in their professional practice working conditions collegial relationships and patient interactions In their own words they provide a view from the front lines both in academic and community settings They disclose the satisfactions and strains in coping with macro policies enacted by government and insurance companies over their career trajectory They describe their residency in internal medicine in a large southern urban medical center as a siege mentality which lessened as they began their careers in *Getting Rid of Patients* the title of Mizrahi s first book 1986 As these doctors moved on in their professional lives more of their experiences were discussed in terms of dissatisfaction with financial remuneration emotional gratification and intellectual fulfillment Such moments of career frustration however were also interspersed with moments of satisfaction at different stages of their medical careers Particularly revealing was whether they were optimistic about the future at each stage of their career and whether they would recommend a medical career to their children Mizrahi s subjects also divulge their private feelings of disillusionment and fear of failure given the malpractice epidemic and lawsuits threatened or actually brought against so many doctors Mizrahi s work covering almost fifty years provides rarely viewed insights into the lives of physicians over a professional life span
