This concept was explored in the poems "Song of the Captured Woman" by James Devaney, and "The Widower in the Country" by Les Murray, and also in the short story "The Secret Life of Walter Minty" by James Thurber. The compositions showed how a person's past experiences and memories, relationships, and interactions with their environment played a significant role in shaping their identity.

A person's memories and past experiences have a significant impact on the way they think, feel and act. This is evident in the poem. The fong of the Captured Woman, by James Devaney, where an isolated woman is depicted. She reminisces on her memories and deep connections with her homeland, and hence emphasizes her longing to be with her people. Through the imagery in the line "... away to the south to my Adurawal River", the poet shows how the woman's experiences in the Murrawal has shaped her as a human being, resulting in her current insecure state and social. withdrawal. Furthermore, with the use of the personal pronoun, "my" the persona exposes the sense of comfort and safety these memories make her feel. The substantial effect that any past experience has on an individual is also apparent in Les Murray's poem "The Widower in the Country". This composition explores the deep contemplation of the protagonist, who, after the death of his wife, has led a routine, monotonous life in response to his grief and sadness. The poem opens with the line "I'll get up soon, and leave my bed miniade "to emphasize how much the widower misses his wife. His mostaleis is again reinforced through the natural imagery and symbolism present in the lines "... windless trees, the nettles in the word ... "and "the roof reflects the sun" when the won reflects upon his past memories, causing his "eyes so water". The death of his wife had a significant impact on the way the man perceived life, regulting in his social with drawal and lack of motivation. In contrast. James Thurber's short story "The Secret life of Walter Misty" reveals how a person's lack of valuable experiences and memories can cause them to feel insecure. The protagonist, Walter Mitty. seeks escape in his fantasies, where he lives a heroic life of thrill and excitement. His mundame lifestyle and lack of worthwhile experiences is reinforced in the repetitive and monotonous tone created by the sayndeton "...
