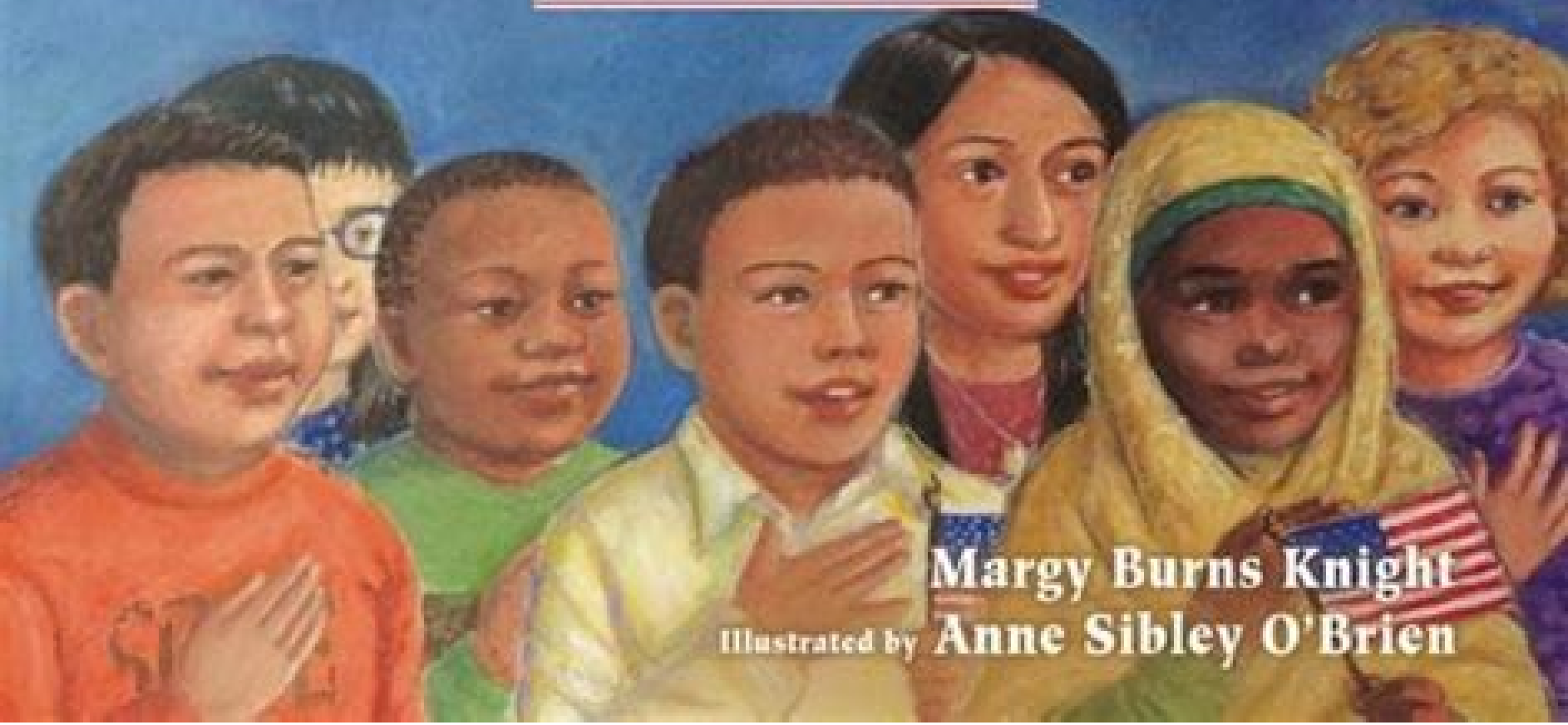

A three part structure is used: Classroom Implementation, a rich description of one lesson in a real classroom; Context Variables, a theoretical explanation of the specific factor the chapter addresses providing the research basis for the sample lesson objectives; Doing Analysis of the Context, several sample lessons for implementation. The lessons are addressed to the teacher with detailed ideas on how to carry out the lesson and evaluate the students understanding of the situational context.
