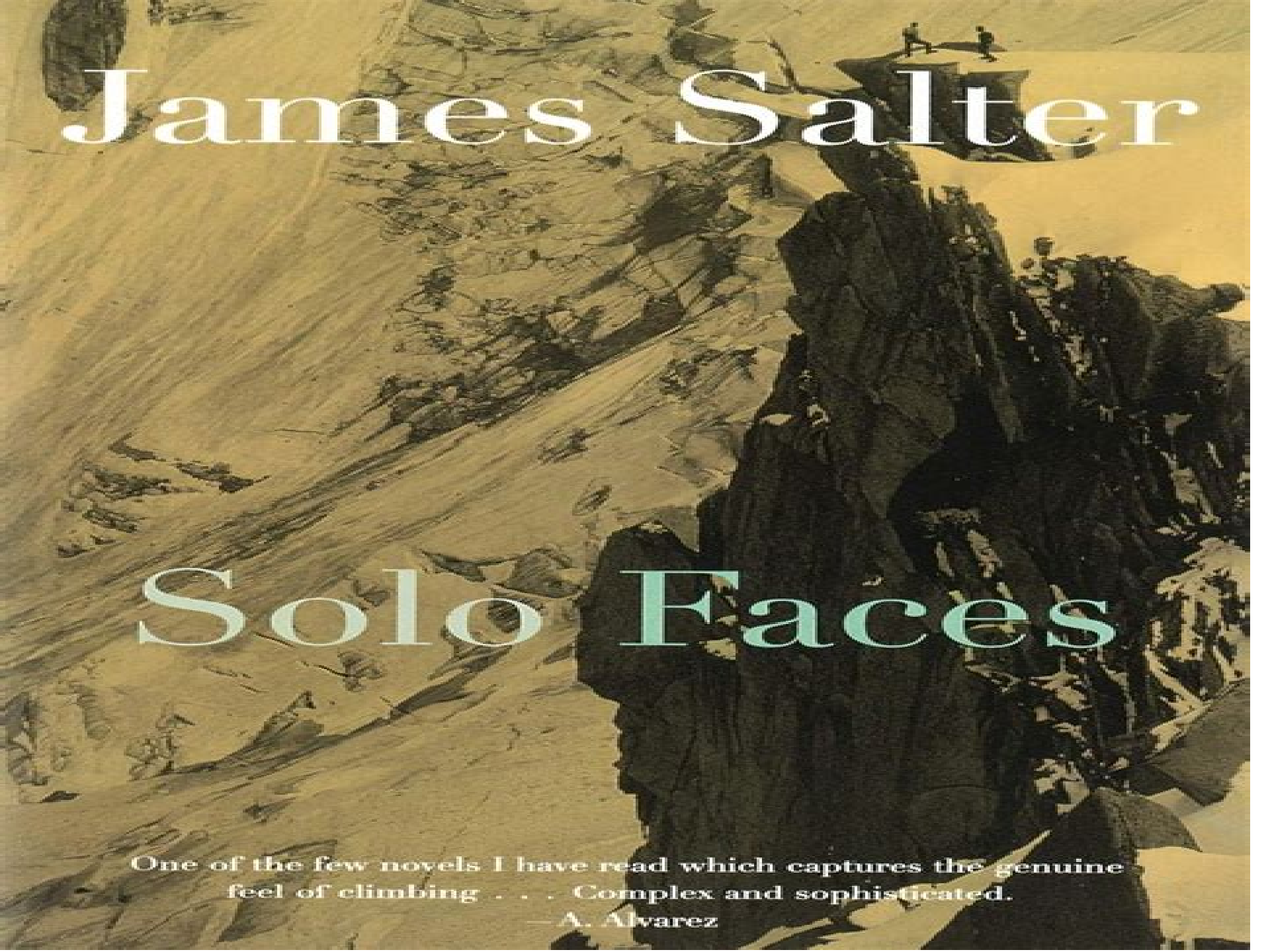

James Salter Jeffrey Meyers, 2024-02-07 Biographer and critic Jeffrey Meyers knew the novelist James Salter 1925-2015 during the last decade of his life; he visited him twice on Long Island and received eighty letters from him. Meyers's knowledge of Salter's life provides many new insights about the personal, literary, and historical background of his work. This appreciative book, the first full-length study in twenty-six years, is intended to introduce Salter to new readers and show his achievement as a writer of novels, stories, screenplays, memoirs, and travel essays. Salter had an extraordinary range of experience: as West Point graduate, fighter pilot in the Korean War, downhill skier, rock climber, and mountain climber; screenwriter and film director; connoisseur of food and wine; world traveler and sophisticated observer.
