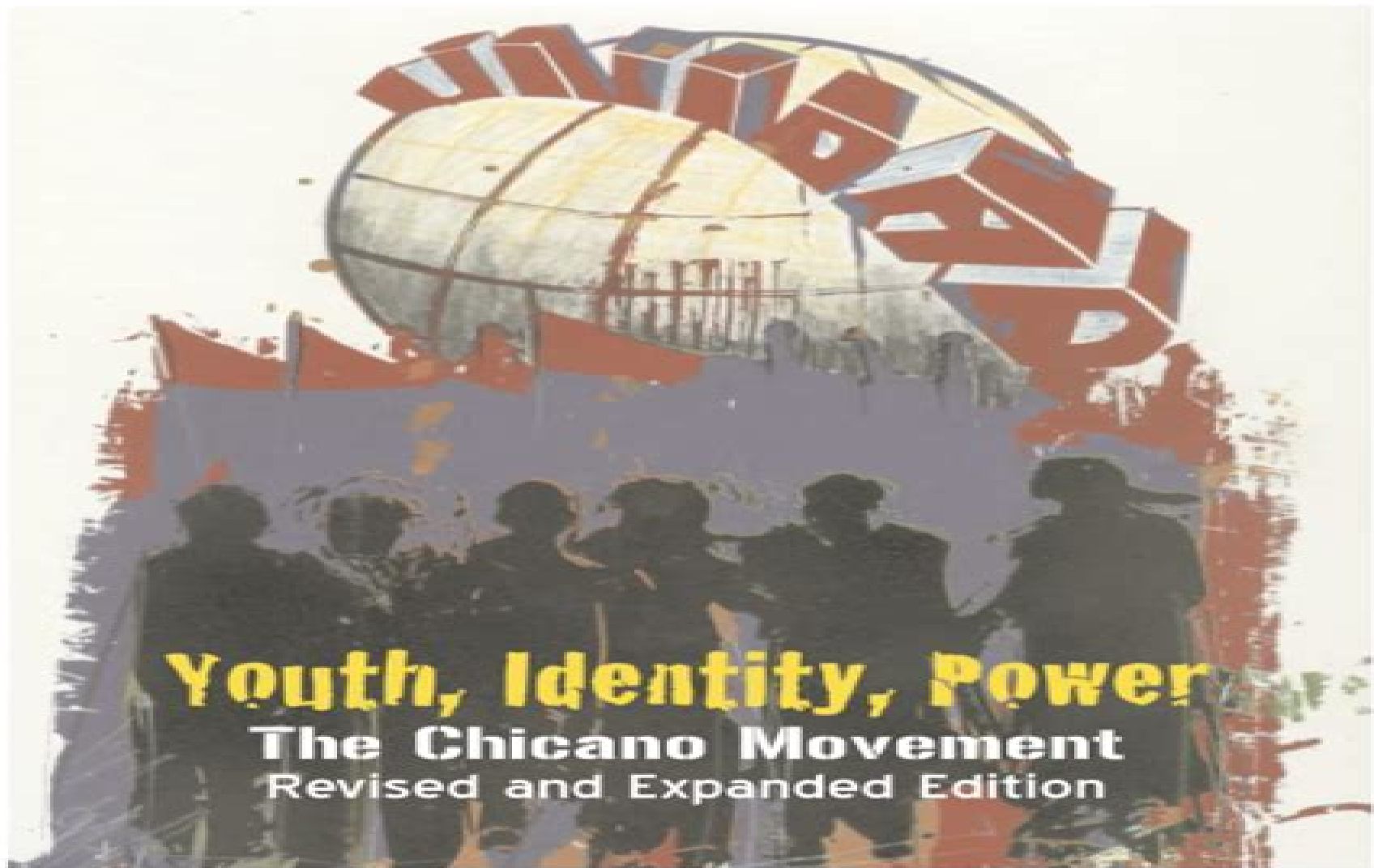

Youth, Identity, Power Carlos Muñoz, 1989 *Youth Identity Power* is a study of the origins and development of Chicano radicalism in America Written by a leader of the Chicano Student Movement of the 1960s who also played a role in the creation of the wider Chicano Power Movement this is the first full length work to appear on the subject It fills an important gap in the history of political protest in the United States The author places the Chicano movement in the wider context of the political development of Mexicans and their descendants in the US tracing the emergence of Chicano student activists in the 1930s and their initial challenge to the dominant racial and class ideologies of the time Munoz then documents the rise and fall of the Chicano Power Movement situating the student protests of the sixties within the changing political scene of the time and assessing the movement's contribution to the cultural development of the Chicano population as a whole He concludes with an account of Chicano politics in the 1980s *Youth Identity Power* was named an Outstanding Book on Human Rights in the United States by the Gustavus Myers Center in 1990

successful they were He argues that while Chicana o activists continued to challenge school segregation in the 1960s as earlier generations had they broadened their efforts to address new concerns such as school funding testing English only curricula the exclusion of undocumented immigrants and school closings They also advocated cultural pride and memory inclusion of the Mexican American community in school governance and opportunities to seek educational excellence in private religious nationalist and secular schools The profusion of strategies has not erased patterns of de facto segregation and unequal academic achievement San Miguel concludes but it has played a key role in expanding educational opportunities The actions he describes have expanded extended and diversified the historic struggle for Mexican American education A

Meeks,2010-01-01 Borders cut through not just places but also relationships politics economics and cultures Eric V Meeks examines how ethno racial categories and identities such as Indian Mexican and Anglo crystallized in Arizona s borderlands between 1880 and 1980 South central Arizona is home to many ethnic groups including Mexican Americans Mexican immigrants and semi Hispanicized indigenous groups such as Yaquis and Tohono O odham Kinship and cultural ties between these diverse groups were altered and ethnic boundaries were deepened by the influx of Euro Americans the development of an industrial economy and incorporation into the U S nation state Old ethnic and interethnic ties changed and became more difficult to sustain when Euro Americans arrived in the region and imposed ideologies and government policies that constructed starker racial boundaries As Arizona began to take its place in the national economy of the United States primarily through mining and industrial agriculture ethnic Mexican and Native American communities struggled to define their own identities They sometimes stressed their status as the region s original inhabitants sometimes as workers sometimes as U S citizens and sometimes as members of their own separate nations In the process they often challenged the racial order imposed on them by the dominant class Appealing to broad audiences this book links the construction of racial categories and ethnic identities to the larger process of nation state building along the U S Mexico border and illustrates how ethnicity can both bring people together and drive them apart *The Culture and Politics of Contemporary Street Gang Memoirs* Josephine Metcalf,2012-07-02 The publication of Sanyika Shakur s *Monster The Autobiography of an L A Gang Member* in 1993 generated a huge amount of excitement in literary circles New York Times book critic Michiko Kakutani deemed it a shocking and galvanic book and set off a new publishing trend of gang memoirs in the 1990s The memoirs showcased tales of violent confrontation and territorial belonging but also offered many of the first journalistic and autobiographical accounts of the much mythologized gang subculture In *The Culture and Politics of Contemporary Street Gang Memoirs* Josephine Metcalf focuses on three of these memoirs Shakur s *Monster* Luis J Rodriguez s *Always Running La Vida Loca* Gang Days in L A and

Outstanding Book Award National Association for Ethnic Studies A multiracial history of civil rights coalitions beyond the farm worker movement in twentieth century Bakersfield California In *Civil Rights in Bakersfield* Oliver Rosales uncovers the role of the multiracial west in shaping the course of US civil rights history Focusing on Bakersfield one of the few sizable cities within California's Central Valley for much of the twentieth century in a region most commonly known as a bastion of political conservatism oil and industrial agriculture Rosales documents how multiracial coalitions emerged to challenge histories of racial segregation and discrimination He recounts how the region was home to both the historic farm worker movement led by Cesar Chavez Dolores Huerta and Larry Itliong and also a robust multiracial civil rights movement beyond the fields This multiracial push for civil rights reform included struggles for fair housing school integration public health media representation and greater political representation for Black and Brown communities In expanding on this history of multiracial activism Rosales further explores the challenges activists faced in community organizing and how the legacies of coalition building contribute to ongoing activist efforts in the Central Valley of today *Becoming Mexipino* Rudy P.

Guevarra, Jr., 2012-05-09 *Becoming Mexipino* is a social historical interpretation of two ethnic groups one Mexican the other Filipino whose paths led both groups to San Diego California Rudy Guevarra traces the earliest interactions of both groups with Spanish colonialism to illustrate how these historical ties and cultural bonds laid the foundation for what would become close interethnic relationships and communities in twentieth century San Diego as well as in other locales throughout California and the Pacific West Coast Through racially restrictive covenants and other forms of discrimination both groups regardless of their differences were confined to segregated living spaces along with African Americans other Asian groups and a few European immigrant clusters Within these urban multiracial spaces Mexicans and Filipinos coalesced to build a world of their own through family and kin networks shared cultural practices social organizations and music and other forms of entertainment They occupied the same living spaces attended the same Catholic churches and worked together creating labor cultures that reinforced their ties often fostering marriages Mexipino children living simultaneously in two cultures

have forged a new identity for themselves Their lives are the lens through which these two communities are examined revealing the ways in which Mexicans and Filipinos interacted over generations to produce this distinct and instructive multiethnic experience Using archival sources oral histories newspapers and personal collections and photographs Guevarra defines the niche that this particular group carved out for itself

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
