Camp, 2006-01-01 These essays by some of the most prominent young historians writing about slavery fill gaps in our understanding of such subjects as enslaved women the Atlantic and internal slave trades the relationships between Indians and enslaved people and enslavement in Latin America Inventive and stimulating the essays model the blending of methods and styles that characterizes the new cultural history of slavery s social political and economic systems Several common themes emerge from the volume among them the correlation between race and identity the meanings contained in family and community relationships gender and life s commonplaces and the literary and legal representations that legitimated and codified enslavement and difference Such themes signal methodological and pedagogical shifts in the field away from master slave or white black race relations models toward perspectives that give us deeper access to the mental universe of slavery Topics of the essays range widely including European ideas about the reproductive capacities of African women and the process of making race in the Atlantic world the contradictions of the assimilation of enslaved African American runaways into Creek communities the consequences and meanings of death to Jamaican slaves and slave owners and the tensions between midwifery as a black cultural and spiritual institution and slave midwives as health workers in a plantation economy Opening our eyes to the personal the contentious and even the intimate these essays call for a history in which both enslaved and enslavers acted in a vast human drama of bondage and freedom salvation and damnation wealth and exploitation

Letters on American Slavery John Rankin, 1833 John Rankin was pastor of the Presbyterian Church of Ripley and Strait Creek in Brown County Ohio His brother Thomas was a Virginia businessman Reverend Rankin wrote these thirteen letters with the desire of aiding and encouraging every effort for the liberation of the enslaved and degraded Africans He rebuts the canard that blacks are an inferior race What people in similar circumstances have ever given stronger marks of genius than are exhibited by the enslaved African of the United States By 1838 the book had gone through at least five editions all of which are far more common than this first edition

New Directions in Slavery Studies Jeff Forret, Christine E. Sears, 2015-11-16 In this landmark essay collection twelve contributors chart the contours of current scholarship in the field of slavery studies highlighting three of the discipline s

Black Walden Elise Lemire, 2011-08-24 Concord Massachusetts has long been heralded as the birthplace of American liberty and American letters It was here that the first military engagement of the Revolutionary War was fought and here that Thoreau came to live deliberately on the shores of Walden Pond Between the Revolution and the settlement of the little cabin with the bean rows however Walden Woods was home to several generations of freed slaves and their children Living on the fringes of society they attempted to pursue lives of freedom promised by the rhetoric of the Revolution and yet withheld by the practice of racism Thoreau was all but alone in his attempt to conjure up the former occupants of these woods Other than the chapter

he devoted to them in Walden the history of slavery in Concord has been all but forgotten In **Black Walden Slavery and Its Aftermath** in Concord Massachusetts Elise Lemire brings to life the former slaves of Walden Woods and the men and women who held them in bondage during the eighteenth century After charting the rise of Concord slaveholder John Cuming Black Walden follows the struggles of Cuming s slave Brister as he attempts to build a life for himself after thirty five years of enslavement Brister Freeman as he came to call himself and other of the town s slaves were able to leverage the political tensions that fueled the American Revolution and force their owners into relinquishing them Once emancipated however the former slaves were permitted to squat on only the most remote and infertile places Walden Woods was one of them Here Freeman and his neighbors farmed spun linen made baskets told fortunes and otherwise tried to survive in spite of poverty and harassment With a new preface that reflects on community developments since the hardcover s publication **Black Walden** reminds us that this was a black space before it was an internationally known green space and preserves the legacy of the people who strove against all odds to overcome slavery and segregation
