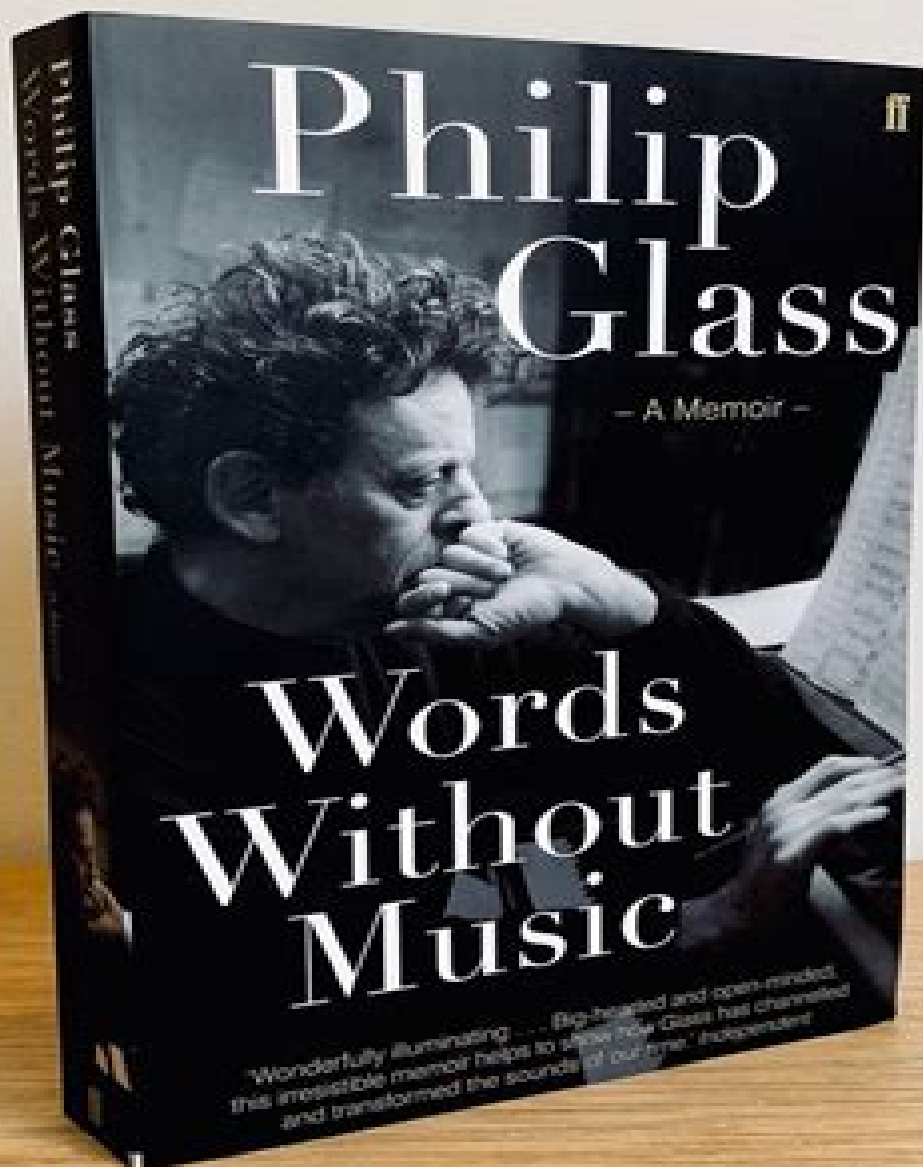

Polidoro, 2018-09-27 Life's experiences often take the form of music poetry novels or prose J P Polidoro a New Hampshire novelist songwriter and poet has compiled within decades of verses that were intended to be inspiration for or lyrics for songs reflections of life and verses that by themselves stand alone In *Words Without Music* Polidoro takes the reader on a visionary lyrical ride of love love lost often with personal elegies odes using nature's beauty as metaphors of life's experiences both euphoric and tragic The thoughts penned within are poems and prose that are often autobiographical but universal in nature His lyrical creations over decades paint a picture in one's mind without need of the artist's brush or support from a melody Polidoro purposely offers no table of contents so that the reader may open the book to any page and enjoy the compositions individually or in total at one's leisure much akin to an individual song Readers may identify with his past and present emotions and his critical thinking of the day especially in a world that is ever changing

United States William Francis Allen, 1867 *Slave Songs of the United States* William Francis Allen, Charles Pickard Ware, Lucy McKim Garrison, 2011-09-01 First published in 1867 *Slave Songs of the United States* represents the work of its three editors all of whom collected and annotated these songs while working in the Sea Islands of South Carolina during the Civil War and also of other collectors who transcribed songs sung by former slaves in other parts of the country The transcriptions are preceded by an introduction written by William Francis Allen the chief editor of the collection who provides his own explanation of the origin of the songs and the circumstances under which they were sung One critic has noted that like the editors' introductions to slave narratives Allen's introduction seeks to lend to slave expressions the honor of white authority and approval Gathered during and after the Civil War the songs most of which are religious reflect the time of slavery and their collectors worried that they were beginning to disappear Allen declares the editors' purpose to be to

Dancer choreographer directors Fred Astaire George Balanchine and Gene Kelly and their colleagues helped to develop a distinctively modern American film dance style and recurring dance genres for the songs and stories of the American musical Freely crossing stylistic and class boundaries their dances were rooted in the diverse dance and music cultures of European immigrants and African American migrants who mingled in jazz age America The new technology of sound cinema let them choreograph and fuse camera movement light and color with dance and music Preserved intact for the largest audiences in dance history their works continue to influence dance and film around the world This book centers them and their colleagues within the history of dance where their work has been marginalized as well as film tracing their development from Broadway to Hollywood 1924-58 and contextualizing them within the American history and culture of their era This modern style like the nation in which it developed was pluralist and populist It drew from aspects of the old world and new high and low theatrical and social dance forms creating new sites for dance from the living room to the street A definitive ingredient was the freer more informal movement and behavior of their jazz age generation which fit with song lyrics that poeticized slangy American English The Gershwins Rodgers and Hart and others wrote not only songs but extended dance driven scores tailored to their choreography giving a new prominence to the choreographer and dancer actor This book discusses how these

choreographers collaborated with directors like Vincente Minnelli and Stanley Donen and cinematographers like Gregg Toland musicians dancers designers and technicians to synergize music and moving image in new ways Eventually concepts and visual musical devices derived from dance making would give entire films the rhythmic flow and feeling of dance Dancing Americans came to be seen around the world as archetypal embodiments of the free spirited optimism and energy of America itself

The Graying of the Raven Aida Adib Bamia,2001 From East to West The raven has turned gray O Reader of the unknown Help us in our ordeal With a fine touch Aida Bamia has explored the work of Muhammad bin al Tayyib Alili c 1894 c 1954 a hitherto virtually unknown oral poet of Algeria bringing to her analysis new understanding of folk poetry as part of a people s collective memory and their resistance to colonization For Alili s audience the despair and suffering faced by poor farmers before independence is embodied by the raven grown old and gray with ceaseless frustration and humiliation Because of its oral and all too often ephemeral nature the work of poets such as Alili could escape close scrutiny by French colonial administrators who sought to eradicate nationalistic and ethnic elements With succinct commentary Bamia presents an outstanding historical and contextual background for Alili s repertoire while she details the richness and variety of poetic forms that had developed in North Africa In doing so she shows an intimate grasp of the poet s repertoire and technique as well as of the colonial and postcolonial implications of Algerian folklore and poetry In their citation for the AUC Middle East Studies Award the judges noted The Graying of the Raven s insightful perspective on Algerian society and the experience of colonization as perceived by the individual folk poet

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
